As some of you may know, my daughter, Kendra, has Spinal Muscular Atrophy (SMA). This means her muscles are very weak and she will not ever crawl, walk, or reach gross motor milestones. Because she is so weak, this affects all major muscles, including her diaphragm, which helps her cough and breathe. Kendra has caught something that is probably viral like a cold, but because her muscles are so weak, it takes a much greater toll on her, which the doctors tell us in SMA kids typically takes 1-2 weeks to overcome. She is quite a fighter, and we too have been helping her fight this off around the clock as well. We hope to all be home very soon.

STUDENT SPOTLIGHT... Each month we will try to feature some work from various students at Saint Clement School to give each of you a glimpse into what students are doing at each grade level. Since the school year has just begun, I would like to use this section to share a letter that we received following the third graders bake sale for cancer research in memory of their dear friend Caitlin:

Dear Mrs. Raisbeck and Third Grade Class:

I am writing to thank each and every one of you for the \$406.50 that you all worked very hard to raise in memory of your dear friend and classmate, Caitlin Recker. Your donation to UW Pediatric Hematology-Oncology Research is greatly appreciated.

This donation will make an important contribution to our research effort dedicated to providing better treatments for children currently being treated with cancer, and for those that will be diagnosed with cancer in the future.

Our University of Wisconsin Pediatric Oncology Program has been an active participant in both clinical and laboratory research progress. We have been actively involved in the largest cooperative clinical trials organization for the treatment of children with cancers worldwide and are providing national leadership to this organization in its leukemia, neuroblastoma, and immunotherapy strategy groups. We are pursuing innovative, experimental therapy approaches here in Madison in clinical trials and are pursuing multiple laboratory leads to help better understand the causes of childhood cancer and provide novel approaches in laboratory models that reflect potential treatments of the future. We have seen particular lab and clinical progress this past year.

One of the laboratory goals of our team involves cancer immunotherapy research. Last year, our national trial of a new immunotherapy for childhood neuroblastoma proved we were on the right track. In addition, this year we have recruited two outstanding physician scientist, Mario Otto MD PhD and Christian Capitini MD. They have joined our research program as faculty this summer and both are pursuing innovative immunotherapy research that will be integrated into our clinical and bone marrow transplant programs.

Your kind support is essential in our team's purchase of supplies and lab equipment for our team's research program. I cannot thank you enough for your generosity to help provide better answers, through research, for children diagnosed with cancer in the future.

In the process of caring for children with cancer over these past three decades, I remain amazed and motivated by the kindness, love, strength, and intelligence that donors, like yourselves, demonstrate when acting generously to help others!

I can assure you that here at UW, and in labs across the country, tireless progress is being made. If only research could move faster!

Please accept my most sincere gratitude and my sincere best wishes to all of you!
